#### WHAT'S HAPPENING AT CHOA

This year we have added some new pool furniture and plan to upgrade the remaining playground areas to comply with new state standards. We will also be getting bids for repainting our complex. It has been eight (8) years since we last painted, and it is time. The community benches need repairing or replacing. It is also time to start replacing the flat roofs, as needed. Antis Roofing and Waterproofing has evaluated all the roofs and is currently doing some repairs to extend the life of many of the roofs.

# TREE ROOTS

Our Association is now over fifty (50) years old and has many beautiful, mature trees that are CHOA's pride and joy. Unfortunately, many of these trees are sending their tree roots into the sewer pipes, causing great expense to CHOA and the removal of some of the tall trees. If any of your toilets do not seem to be functioning properly, get them checked by a plumber. As a preventive measure, a hydrojetting company will be checking the pipes and clearing out any tree roots that are found. The trees that are removed are being replaced with trees with more vertical roots to alleviate this problem. Both the hydrojetting and tree replacements are costly.

# LARGE ITEM PICKUPS

On just one (1) day, CHOA's landscaper hauled away several mattresses, a couch, and an old barbecue. This costs CHOA **EXTRA**. Remember, homeowners are eligible for twelve (12) **FREE** large item pickups per year so please make the effort to contact Management at 949-581-4988 to request a pickup.
